The figures, set against a rich green/blue background, completely dominate the composition. Their gestures and the rhythms of their bodies focus attention on the crucial moment of the narrative.

The shape of the bowl and the warmth of the skin tones suggest Christianity's Middle Eastern origins. The dress is simple and workman-like; these figures could be from any age and country. The simple, everyday act of washing a guest's feet before offering hospitality becomes, through the words and actions of Jesus, pregnant with significance.
