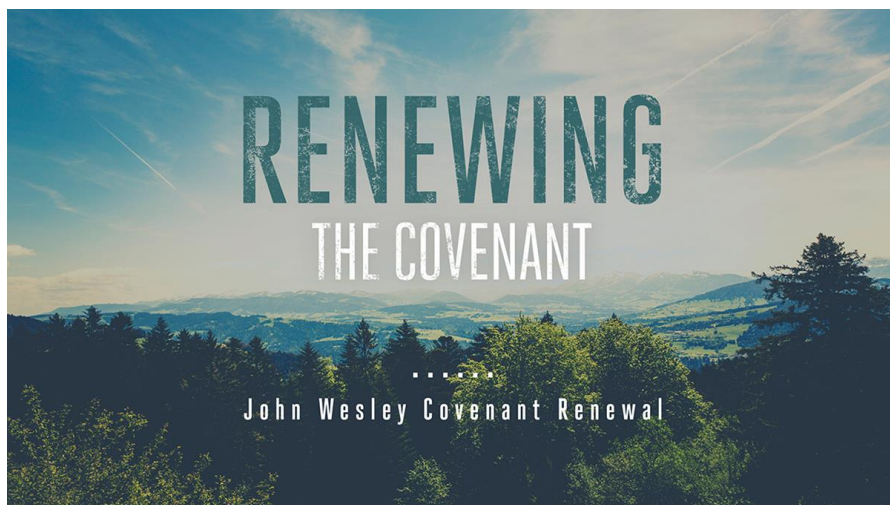

Six weeks with St Paul in Sunny Corinth!

Today we begin a mini-series focussing on St Paul's first letter to the church in Corinth. We start in chapter eleven and his advice about worship, the importance of Communion and Jesus' New Covenant (11:23-26). Next Sunday we will explore his description of the church as a body with many parts (12:12-31) and then on February 3rd his famous poem about love (chapter 13).

The following three weeks we will consider the Gifts of the Spirit (chapter 14), Feb 17th Christ's resurrection (15) and finally on Feb 24th his parting words and advice to his friends in Corinth (chapter 16).
